

The Haliburton Hospital Auxiliary has been looking forward to supporting the new Palliative Care Centre, to be located in the Haliburton Hospital, since this project was first discussed several years ago.

A major fund raising campaign is now underway, with a goal of \$900.000. This project will not be receiving any Provincial funding, and will rely on donations.

Plans for the new centre include two bedroom suites, a family room, and additional space. The Auxiliary is contributing \$25,000 for landscaping and a Memorial Garden.
