Radiothon raised over \$33,000 to be directed toward vital transportation needs through Community Support Services.

These shared accomplishments are a result of exceptional collaboration and the generous and sustained engagement from sponsors, participants, volunteers and donors who care about local health care in the Highlands. Both events demonstrate that once again, we are a community that cares.

What are we raising funds for?

Diagnostic Imaging including the replacement of aging equipment (ultrasound, image archiving) and the addition of new technology, specifically a CT Scanner and CT Mammography.

Meals on Wheels and medically-required transportation subsidies continue to require funding due to the real and growing needs in the community. Community Support Services transportation, to purchase a passenger vehicle that will take the pressure off the aging wheelchair-accessible vans. Education grants enable current HHHS staff to access training and build their skills while continuing to serve the local community.

Emily completed her training to become a Personal Support Worker this summer (with flying colours!).
